2009 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program Local Solicitation

The Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Local Program allows local governments to support a broad range of activities to prevent and control crime and to improve the criminal justice system. The Recovery Act Local JAG program will solicit applications from eligible tribes, and units of local government for local initiatives, technical assistance, training, personnel, equipment, supplies, contractual support, and information systems for criminal justice, as well as research and evaluation activities that will improve or enhance: law enforcement programs; prosecution and court programs; prevention and education programs; corrections and community corrections programs; drug treatment and enforcement programs; planning, evaluation, and technology improvement programs; and crime victim and witness programs (other than compensation). OVC FY09 Services for Domestic Minor Victims of Human Trafficking

Department of Justice Office for Victims of Crime announces funds for a demonstration project to identify promising practices in the delivery of a comprehensive array of services to victims of human trafficking who are U.S. citizens or lawful permanent residents under the age of 18. This program furthers the Department's mission by enhancing the social service field's response to victims of human trafficking. County governments and others are eligible for this funding. 2009 HIV/AIDS Prevention and Support Services for Women Partners of Incarcerated/Recently Released Men

Department of Health and Human Services announces funds to establish a gender-specific, peer led HIV prevention education project for women intimate partners of incarcerated/recently released males. The project shall develop a coalition of support/transition services for women partners and their families through coordinating local/state departments of health, healthcare providers, AIDS service organizations, social services, community organizations, correctional facilities and criminal justice offices. County governments and others are eligible for this funding. Deadline for applying is July 17, 2009.

OVC FY09 Services for Victims of Human Trafficking

Department of Justice Office for Victims of Crime announces funds to provide timely, comprehensive services to precertified victims of severe forms of human trafficking and enhance interagency collaboration and coordination of the provision of such services.
