Here’s the excerpt from the SNR’s “Impaired Waters Cleanup Plan” report on future, potential WQIF agreements that would be added to the list of grant commitments:

In addition to the 56 current grant agreements, there is the potential for about 50 projects to be added to the WQIF program over the coming years. DEQ has 26 grant applications pending that have not yet received signed agreements (the majority of these still need to develop the required Preliminary Engineering Report). Another 24 eligible facilities have not yet applied. Many of these owners were able to phase construction or delay a capital upgrade project through use of the Nutrient Credit Exchange Program, thus allowing for economical use of the limited funds and an orderly schedule for the upgrade projects completed or underway.
