2017 GENERAL ASSEMBLY CONVENES; Look for Capitol Contact on Tuesdays and Thursdays

The 2017 General Assembly session will span from January 11 to February 25, and legislators will deliberate on many issues critical to local government, including tax, state budget, education funding, pension funding and other public policy matters.

<u>Capitol Contact</u> is published every Tuesday and Thursday starting today. Please check VACo's website often to get the latest information and bill updates. Also, be on the lookout for a weekly legislative video recapping issues affecting counties. VACo will continue to release its newsletter, <u>County Connections</u>, around the first and 15th of each month.

Over the past year, VACo consulted with the developers of FlagPoll, a software platform that allows you to easily view and weigh in on issues that are most important to counties.

FlagPoll features a personalized intuitive dashboard where you can learn more about each issue, leave comments, keep track of revisions to legislative bills and read your past comments on similar issues.

Key Dates for 2017 General Assembly Session

The Joint Rules Committee met on December 16 to adopt the procedural resolution that will set out the schedule for the 2017 General Assembly session. Although the procedural resolution will be considered by the full House and Senate in January, typically it is agreed to without amendments. Key dates in the procedural resolution are as follows:

- **January 11:** General Assembly convenes at noon. Prefiled legislation must be submitted by 10 a.m.; this is also the last day to file bills dealing with the Virginia Retirement System or legislation creating or continuing a study.
- **January 13:** Budget amendments by General Assembly members must be submitted by 5 p.m.
- **January 20:** All bills must be filed by 3 p.m.
- **February 5:** The Senate Finance and House Appropriations Committees must report their respective budgets.
- **February 7:** Crossover (deadline for legislation to pass its chamber of origin)
- **February 9:** Deadline for each chamber to complete work on its budget
- **February 20:** Deadline for committee action on legislation
- **February 25:** Scheduled adjournment *sine die*
- April 5: Reconvened session to consider the Governor's amendments and vetoes
