# About the development and adoption of VACo's annual legislative program

- **1.** Spring regional meetings: VACo members are invited to attend regional meetings to identify and discuss key statewide legislative and policy issues.
- 2. Resolutions Committee meetings: The committee oversees the development of the annual Legislative Program. It meets in early fall and during the annual conference in November. The committee receives legislative updates during the annual legislative session.

The Resolutions Committee includes the six members of VACo's Executive Committee and the chairs and vice chairs of VACo's seven steering committees. VACo's President-Elect chairs the Resolutions Committee.

The seven steering committees are Economic Development and Planning, Education, Environment and Agriculture, Finance, General Government, Health and Human Resources and Transportation.


- **3.** Steering Committees: The seven steering committees meet at least twice once in late summer and again in November during the annual conference. The Steering Committees develop their policy sections for the annual Legislative Program.
- **4.** VACo membership: The VACo membership adopts the new Legislative Program during the annual business meeting on the last day of the annual conference in November.
