About the HRTPO

Federal regulations require that urbanized areas throughout the United States have a Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) to conduct a continuing, cooperative and comprehensive transportation planning process. Urbanized areas are defined as areas with a population of 200,000 or greater, known as Transportation Management Areas (TMA). The Hampton Roads Transportation Planning Organization (HRTPO) serves as the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for the Hampton Roads region of Virginia and serves over 1.7 million people in 15 jurisdictions. The HRTPO is responsible for transportation planning and programming in the Hampton Roads region and serves as a resource of technical expertise to its member local governments. The Position

The Hampton Roads Transportation Planning Organization (HRTPO) is seeking a candidate for a Transportation Analyst. The Transportation Analyst will perform routine professional work in the analysis of transportation funding and legislation. In addition, the successful candidate will be involved in other assignments in the areas of transportation planning and programming, including transportation finance and a variety of transportation studies. This position requires the ability to work well with stakeholders, as well as professional and support staff. In addition, excellent communication and time management skills, including the ability to interpret and clearly communicate technical analyses via written reports and presentations (Excel, Word, Access, PowerPoint, etc.), are required. Regular attendance is an essential requirement of this position.

The ideal candidate will have:

- Knowledge of the theories, principles, and techniques of transportation planning
- Knowledge of federal and state transportation regulations.
- The ability to interpret and clearly communicate technical analyses via written reports and presentations; excellent writing skills
- Highly developed verbal, listening, communication and interpersonal skills with ability to think critically
- Experience in ESRI ARC/GIS
- The ability to work well with stakeholders, planning professionals and agency staff to develop positive, successful working relationships
- Strong quantitative abilities
- The ability to work effectively as part of a team and thrive in a fast-paced environment
- The ability to follow a supervisor's instructions & work both independently collaboratively on multiple projects
- The ability to appropriately manage time to meet deadlines; strong attention to detail, follow-through and organization.
- A strong interest and/or experience in transportation planning
- Knowledge of and experience in transit, rail and non-highway modes of transportation is desirable
- Qualified applicants must be authorized to work in the U.S. without employer sponsorship

- Master's degree in Civil Engineering or Urban Planning with a transportation focus
- Bachelor's degree with 3-4 years of progressively responsible experience in local, regional or state transportation planning will be considered in lieu of a Master's degree.
