## 2019 Virginia Association of Counties - Achievement Award Submission

### **OVERVIEW**

The power of kindness is infectious, positive, and necessary in our society today. Kindness Day, initially organized by the Louisa County Public Schools, has been an extraordinarily effective tool in spreading kindness both within our County and outside of our borders.

The program is simple: staff plan and publicize Kindness Day projects such as helping out at community functions, donating to worthy causes, assisting those in need, and others. The projects take place on designated Kindness Days which occur every few months. On Kindness Day, those who are helping out wear their Kindness Day t-shirts, perform their projects, and we watch kindness spread!

Several businesses and organizations have taken notice and gotten involved in the efforts, which have stretched from communities here in Louisa all the way to the Carolinas as we have assisted in their Hurricane Recovery efforts.





#### **PROGRAM DETAILS**

Kindness Day is a community-wide effort intended to foster kindness through working together to help one another within the intent of spreading a spirit of "paying it forward" within our County and beyond. The program was initiated by the Louisa County Public Schools, and the County government soon became involved as well. The effort has since spread to local businesses and other organizations.

The program is extremely simple – staff each receive a Kindness Day tshirt, and a team in each organization (County, Schools, etc.) works together to identify worthy projects and efforts for upcoming Kindness Days, which take place several times a year. Team efforts are planned and staff sign up to assist.

On Kindness Day, staff are allowed to dress casually if they wear their Kindness Day tshirts, and they participate in projects during business hours. Project examples include:

- Donating hours to community causes, such as food banks and animal shelters
- Spending time visiting with the elderly at nursing homes and related facilities
- Bagging groceries and carrying them to cars at local stores
- Road cleanups
- Donations of money or supplies to worthy causes

Pictures are posted on social media, others take notice, more projects are planned, the program builds on itself, and our community is better for the effort! The program costs are minimal, and the time investment pays dividends as others in our community take up the charge as well. Having the program in our schools adds further benefit – at an early age, we are teaching future members of our community the power of kindness and simple ways to positively impact those around them.

#### **RESULTS**

Kindness Day continues to generate significant, positive and long-lasting effects in our community and beyond. Project-specific examples and pictures are included below.
