Virginia's Public Safety Broadband Network

The Commonwealth's First Responder Network Authority (FirstNet) outreach campaign is ongoing and engages regional and local entities with public safety communications interests.

This one-day conference will provide attendees with an explanation of FirstNet's proposed Virginia State Plan, Virginia's actions to study the Plan, and various technologies that will leverage Virginia's future public safety dedicated broadband network. Attendees will have a chance to ask questions, which enables sponsors to collect feedback for review and analysis of FirstNet's impact on the Commonwealth.

The Virginia Public Safety Broadband Network (VaPSBN) team is comprised of the FirstNet State Point of Contact/Statewide Interoperability Coordinator, Program Assistants, Advisors, and administrative staff.

The genesis of FirstNet was a 9/11 Commission recommendation calling for a public safety dedicated nationwide mobile broadband network. Codified by Federal statute in 2012, FirstNet was established as an independent authority within the Department of Commerce and given the responsibility to build, deploy, and operate the network.

FirstNet's mission is to operate and maintain the first high-speed, nationwide wireless broadband network dedicated to public safety operations. The network will enhance response and critical information access for first responders within the Commonwealth. FirstNet will create a reliable, resilient broadband network accessed by broadband devices and applications designed to meet public safety requirements.
