

Stafford County Administrator Tom Foley announces retirement effective July 1, 2020



Stafford County Administrator Tom Foley today announced his retirement from the County effective July 1, 2020, after over 30 years of public service in Virginia. His decision to provide a six-month notice is to allow ample time for the Board to find his replacement and assist with the transition.

"Stafford is an incredible place that I will truly miss and I have enjoyed my time in the County," said Foley in announcing his retirement. "Moving onto another phase in life is exciting, and I am so proud of what we have accomplished for our community. It has been an honor to serve Stafford citizens and I am especially thankful for the devoted and professional county employees and the partnership with the members of the Board of Supervisors. I will always cherish my time here in Stafford and I am grateful for the support I have received from colleagues and friends."

Mr. Foley has 30 years of local government experience. Finishing his tenure at Stafford County, he also served 17 and a half years at Albemarle County, 11 as Deputy County Executive, and the last six of those years as County Executive. He also holds eight years as a County Administrator in two other Virginia counties.

During his time with the County, Foley led several initiatives to improve services and efficiencies across the organization, including the implementation of the long-term financial planning process and the Board's first Strategic Plan for the County. He also saw the County through receiving a Triple-AAA bond rating status, the passage of a Public Safety Step Plan and the consolidation of two departments into the current Department of Public Works. Foley's specific experience in facilitating high-performance principles aided Stafford in developing leadership throughout the organization through enhanced employee engagement and multi-level strategic planning together with the launch of Stafford's newest vision and behavioral values.

"We have really come a long way since bringing Tom on board. His leadership and guidance for the Board and the staff are tremendously appreciated," said Board of Supervisor Gary Snellings, Chairman of the Board. "Stafford is one of the fastest-growing counties in Virginia facing several complex challenges, and Tom has met those challenges head-on ensuring that Stafford is a dynamic, adaptable organization benefiting citizens with careful use of taxpayer dollars. We thank him for the solid foundation he has established for the future and wish him well."

"His ability to lead and develop new leaders within the organization was one of the most compelling reasons we hired Tom. From the start, he focused on advancing the organization's high-performance principles raising the expectations for County operations and customer service," said Board of Supervisors member Meg Bohmke, who was on the Board during the hiring of Foley. "I will sorely miss him and wish him the best on his next step."

The Board is responsible for the hiring of a new county administrator and will begin immediately.



Finance Forum Previews Busy General Assembly Session Ahead



Approximately 150 participants at the 2020 Finance Forum kicked off the New Year with a deep dive into major financial issues affecting local governments. The event, co-hosted by VACo and VML, was an opportunity for attendees to receive briefings on the Governor's introduced budget and its implications for local governments, as well as other top issues of interest. VACo President Steve Bowen reminded attendees of the significant financial issues to be decided in the upcoming General Assembly session and encouraged VACo and VML members to remain involved in the discussions.

Both Deputy Secretary of Finance Joe Flores and Jim Regimbal also stressed the importance of local engagement in state budget deliberations. Deputy Secretary Flores explained the process by which the introduced budget was developed over the summer and fall, and provided highlights of major spending and savings items. He suggested that the Administration would have an "open door" for additional discussions about items that were not included in the budget. Jim Regimbal's presentation framed the biennium budget as an opportunity for the state to strengthen its partnership with local governments and offered several recommendations for ways in which the state could alleviate local fiscal stress, such as fully funding staffing standards for Constitutional officers, assisting localities with responsibilities under the Children's Services Act, or paying down the unfunded liability in the Virginia Retirement System's teacher plan.

Patricia Bishop, Director of the Virginia Retirement System, <u>explained</u> how the proposed employer contribution rates for the new biennium were developed; rate increases are largely attributable to lowering the expected rate of return for VRS's investments as a result of concerns about slowing global growth. *Richmond Times Dispatch* columnist Jeff Schapiro provided some important context on the political landscape against which the budget deliberations will take place.

Two sets of presentations on information technology-related issues concluded the afternoon. Rick Ellrod, Director of the Communications Policy and Regulation Division in Fairfax County, and Debra Bryan, Associate City Attorney in the Virginia Beach City Attorney's Office, spoke about current telecommunications issues, including challenges posed by recent Federal Communications Commission actions to local authority to regulate siting of telecommunications facilities and to work with cable providers on important in-kind contributions made as part of cable franchise agreements. Daniel Persico, Chief Information Officer for the Department of Elections, and Barry Condrey, Chief Information Officer for Chesterfield County, discussed the cybersecurity standards recently adopted by the State Board of Elections for local IT systems that interact with the state's voter registration database and how the state is working within existing resources to assist localities in complying with the new standards.


Earlier in her career, Walton was the Vice President of Design for Parker, Inc., a design and engineering consulting firm in Richmond.

VACo Releases 2020 Legislative Program






