



AASC'S Public Transit Division

- Four County Transit is a fully coordinated public transit system serving the AASC Service Area.
- Deviated fixed route system with multiple routes in each county with assigned stops and times.
- Majority of routes connect with transfer points allowing travel within and between counties.
- Design of routes include major housing communities, including senior housing.
- Design of routes include life needs such as retail and grocery stores, medical facilities, government offices, library, colleges, etc.





Opportunity for our older population

- We must take care of our aging population.
- Freedom, independence and improved quality of life.
- It must be marketed to help everyone understand it, especially in a rural environment.
- Route schedules include hourly stops at all agency senior community centers.
- Most agency participants ride the bus to the centers.
- Provides social interaction. Many seniors go out on the same days to shop, etc. as a group event.
- Staff training focus is on being friendly and understanding while providing assistance.





Working to improve our service

- Continually review routes to stay current with changes such as housing, employment opportunities and shopping centers.
- Listening to the community to address growing transportation needs.
- Working with local governments to expand service with new routes.
- Expanding into non emergency medical transportation working with companies such as Veyo.
- Providing transportation for veterans to the two area veterans hospitals.
- Contract PACE transportation for non-PACE medical transportation.




HOW TO CONNECT AT THE INTERSECTION
