








VACo Releases 2021 Legislative Program



After months of steering committee meetings, lively debate and participation through the Association's legislative process, VACo adopted its <u>2021 Legislative Program</u>. The Legislative Program is organized according to VACo's Steering Committees.

<u>VACo's 2021 Legislative Program</u> addresses priorities in the realms of Economic Development and Planning, Education, Environment and Agriculture, Finance, General Government, Health and Human Services, and Transportation.

VACo Joins the Virginia Faces of Transit Coalition



VACo recently joined the <u>Virginia Faces of Transit Coalition</u>, which is an effort organized by the Virginia Transit Association (VTA) to promote the benefits of transit during this time of ridership declines due to COVID-19. The coalition aims to convince decision makers to maintain financial support of transit due to its nature as an essential service for many Virginians who need it to access work, medical care, school, and basic necessities. Transit is also critical in reducing traffic from single-occupancy vehicles and their carbon emissions.

The coalition's video (www.FacesofTransit.org) highlights the different reasons why public transit matters. There are 40 transit agencies in the Commonwealth of Virginia that receive capital and operating support from the Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation (DRPT). According to data from VTA, in FY 2019 public transportation provided \$4.4 billion in economic benefits to Virginia, reduced passenger miles on roads by 1.1 billion, and prevented more than 130,000 metric tons of carbon emissions from being released.

COVID-19 poses unique challenges to transit systems including reduced ridership numbers, which in turn impacts funding based on ridership fares. In FY 2019, fares accounted for approximately 26 percent of Virginia's transit funding. High unemployment rates and work-from-home arrangements have eliminated commuting for many workers, while fear of contracting the virus on buses or trains is a disincentive for other riders. Transit agencies and workers still provide essential services while focusing on the safety of employees and riders.

In March, DRPT and the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) authorized \$11 million in statewide public transportation operating funding to be made available to all Virginia public transportation agencies suffering major ridership losses and additional operating expenses due to the pandemic. This was the equivalent of one month of statewide operating revenues allocated to the Commonwealth Mass Transit Fund. Additionally, passage of the federal CARES Act provided Virginia with approximately \$456 million in funding that did not require a state or local match and is nearly three times the amount of federal transit funding appropriated to Virginia Transit Agencies in FY 2020.

This followed actions by the 2020 regular session of the General Assembly to reorganize the transportation funding formulas giving public transportation 23 percent of the transportation trust fund. This is projected to grow transit's funding over biennial budget from \$1.34 billion to \$1.41 billion and increase total new money for transit by \$712 million over the Six-Year Improvement Plan (SYIP). Legislation also created a transit ridership incentive program to expand regional corridors and reduce fares.

Despite this infusion of aid, many transit agencies are facing large budget gaps for FY 2021 and FY 2022. For instance, the Washington Metropolitan Transit Authority (WMATA) projects an expected budget gap of more than \$200 million for FY 2021 and potentially more than \$700 million for FY 2022. VACo President and Chairman of the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors Jeff McKay recently wrote an op-ed in the *Washington Post* highlighting the need for additional federal aid.

VACo will continue to advocate for additional state and federal support for public transit and transportation improvements in general. More information and resources pertaining to public transit can be viewed here.

Broadband Funding Opportunities and Updates



The next meeting of the <u>Commonwealth Connect Coalition</u> is scheduled for December 17. Topics of discussion will include a preview of the 2021 General Assembly Session, and the potential results of two broadband funding sources. At the federal level, the <u>Rural Digital Opportunity Fund (RDOF) \$16 billion phase I auction round</u> concluded this week and the results should be published in the near future. There were approximately 189,000 eligible locations in the Commonwealth. On the state level, many counties are eagerly awaiting the announcement of Virginia Telecommunications Initiative (<u>VATI</u>) awards. This information is pending as the Virginia Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) will likely have to re-scope and re-score projects after the RDOF results have been announced.

Rethinking Manufactured Housing in Richmond



Richmond-based nonprofit project:Homes received \$500,000 in funding from Virginia Housing's new Innovative Demonstrations Program. The nonprofit's mission is to challenge the misconceptions of what defines affordable housing through production and preservation of high-quality affordable homes, large-scale home repairs and improved accessibility and energy efficiency for existing homes.

The proposal: Bermuda Estates

With help from the innovation grant, nonprofit project: Homes will place six modified modular homes in Richmond's Bermuda Estates Manufactured Home Community, a park recently acquired by the organization.

"Our team is designing a new type of manufactured housing," said Madeline Petrie, Director of Marketing and Communications for project: Homes. "They will fit on the same footprint as a traditional mobile home but be designed at a much higher quality and will last much longer."

These hybrid homes will be HUD-certified, built to building code and have the ability to be placed in a mobile home park or on a private lot. The idea is to transform the traditional mobile home into something that will prevent residents from purchasing a depreciating asset and rather allow them to invest in a home that at the very least holds its wealth, while maintaining the strengths of the community itself.

Petrie said they have also partnered with the Virginia Center for Housing Research (VCHR) at Virginia Tech to analyze the process and create a report comparing the building efficiencies of the new manufactured homes to that of stick-built homes.

FOIA Council endorses legislative proposals for 2021 session

Virginia Freedom of Information Advisory Council

The FOIA Council met on December 2, 2020 to consider the work of its three subcommittees which studied Phishing, Electronic Meetings and Disclosure of Criminal Incident Information. The committee endorsed legislative proposals in all three areas of study. The Phishing legislation will likely be carried by Delegate Heretick who has been championing this matter.

The Electronic Records subcommittee recommended two legislative proposals. The first was a revised draft of Delegate Levine's HB 321 from the 2020 regular session. This bill would allow a member of a public body to attend a meeting electronically if there is a physical quorum present, the public body has a policy allowing electronic meetings and they notify the public body that they are providing care to a family member with a serious medical condition that prevents the member's physical attendance. This proposal would allow an individual member to participate electronically 2 times per calendar year or up to 25 percent of the yearly meetings, whichever is greater.

Also endorsed was a draft bill dealing with electronic meetings during emergencies. VACo worked with VML, the Virginia Press Association and the Virginia Coalition for Open Government on a proposal which was endorsed by the Committee. The proposal incorporates some of the Governor's budget language on electronic meetings during emergency conditions which is currently in place.

The Committee also endorsed a revised version of Delegate Hurst's HB 5090 introduced in the 2020 legislative session dealing with release of criminal incident information.
