REENERGIZE

Residential Property Assessed Clean Energy (R-PACE) Work Group

- R-PACE provides a mechanism for homeowners to implement clean energy improvements to their home while financing the cost through their property tax bill.
- DMME is leading an R-PACE work group pursuant to <u>Budget Item 125 (E)</u> in the 2020 2022 biennium budget.
- The work group is charged with determining the feasibility and approach of creating a Virginia R-PACE Program.
- Any potential R-PACE program would require permissive legislation from the General Assembly followed by an enabling ordinance from local government to take effect.

JLARC found that the two coal tax credits generate economic losses for the state and no longer appear relevant.



JLARC also stated the coalfield region's existing economic development strategies should be comprehensively evaluated.

RESULTING LEGISLATION

Del. Hudson (<u>HB1899</u>) and Sen. McPike (<u>SB1252</u>) introduced bills to repeal the coal tax credits.

During the committee process, the bills were amended to create a workgroup led by DMME.

The bills passed the General Assembly and were signed into law by Governor Northam.



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WORKGROUP LANGUAGE – WHO?

DMME, in coordination with:

- Southwest Virginia Workforce Development Board
- Council on Environmental Justice



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WORKGROUP LANGUAGE – WHAT?

Recommendations for how the Commonwealth can provide economic transition support to the coalfield region, with a particular focus on:

- Workforce redevelopment,
- Economic diversification,
- Reclamation of coal-impacted lands and brownfields,
- Community revitalization,
- Infrastructure improvements, and
- Clean energy development.

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Coal production peaked in 1990, has decreased 70% since then.

▶ Nearly all coal fired power plants will close by 2025.

DMME is realigning its resources to reflect the shift toward renewable energy and associated economic development opportunities.

New position in Richmond to focus on energy equity

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Effective October 1, DMME becomes the Department of Energy.

Worker safety and environmental protection will remain important priorities.

The agency will continue to build on its economic development successes.

Over 200 businesses on previously mined land.

Abandoned Mine Land (AML) water projects

DMME has awarded \$47.8 million for public water projects, creating 1,400 jobs.

▶ DMME has received \$40 million for economic development efforts.
