

Counties should have received voting credential forms and proxy forms by mail in September. If you did not return your form to VACo in the mail, you can submit it to the VACo Credentials Committee at its meeting on Monday, November 15 at 1 p.m. in Room 1783. You can also drop it off at the conference registration desk before the Credentials Committee meeting.



Landmark legislation adopted in 2020 has embarked the Commonwealth on a journey of achieving zero greenhouse gas emissions from electric utilities by the middle of this century. This transformation of the energy sector will result in a wholesale change in not only how energy is produced, but how it is delivered. For example, significant investments in solar and wind facilities, combined with a substantial "rebuilding" of the electric grid system, present both opportunities and challenges for county officials grappling with how to integrate these changes within the local landscape and economy. This session will provide both a legislative and industry perspective on what the future holds, and what Virginia's counties can expect in the coming decades to help them prepare for these changes.

Legislation took effect on May 1, 2021, allowing local governments and school boards throughout Virginia to enact ordinances that allow their employees to form unions and engage in collective bargaining agreements with their employers. Though long established in other states, the new law grants flexibility to Virginia's local government employers as to how they define bargaining units, set the terms and conditions of the bargaining process, and resolve impasses. This session will discuss factors that local governments should reflect upon should they consider opting into collective bargaining with their employees.

# About the development and adoption of VACo's annual legislative program

- 1. In January the VACo President appoints VACo members to the eight VACo steering committees and names chairs and vice chairs. The eight steering committees are Economic Development and Planning, Education, Energy, Environment and Agriculture, Finance, General Government, Health and Human Resources, and Transportation.
- **2.** VACo members are invited to attend regional meetings held April-September throughout the VACo regions in the Commonwealth to identify and discuss key legislative issues.
- 3. The steering committees meet once in late summer and again in November during the annual conference. The Steering Committees develop their position statements for the annual Legislative Program, based in part on information received during the regional meetings.
- **4.** In early Fall, prior to the annual conference, the membership receives a Preliminary Legislative Program. This draft is revised during the annual conference.
- **5.** The VACo Resolutions Committee oversees the development of the annual Legislative Program. It meets during the annual conference in November. The Resolutions Committee includes the six members of VACo's Executive Committee and the chairs and vice chairs of VACo's eight steering committees. VACo's President-Elect chairs the Resolutions Committee.
- **6.** The VACo membership adopts the new Legislative Program during the annual business meeting on the last day of the annual conference in November.




