#### **Abstract:**

"Where's my son..." Words I'll never forgot... I asked her "Who's your son?" to which she replied, "Austin." I then asked, "who are you?" and she replied, "I'm Melissa, his mother." I looked right at her and with as much empathy as I could muster, I told her, "I'm so sorry, Austin was killed in a crash."

The In Memory of Campaign started after the Chesterfield County Police Department's fatal crash team worked a wreck on June 10, 2020. The tragedy of that fatal crash was not any different than most others, with families impacted, loves ones lost, and stress on officers, but our officers took that night and for some reason wanted to make a change, perhaps prevent another fatality, even just one would be worth the effort. So, with permission from families of several fatal crashes we started to work out ways to highlight the loss, humanize it and publicize it all in hope that we can create discussion to slow down, don't drink and drive, or wear a seatbelt.

### The Problem:

Chesterfield County is frequently in the top 10 localities in Virginia for traffic fatalities. This is not a category that one likes to be a leader. Our problem is how do we prevent crashes that are the result of bad decisions of an involved party? The reckless speeding, the DUI's, failing to wear seatbelts, texting while driving or any of the other distractions that drivers face. How do we create discussion among family and friends about safe driving beyond what new drivers get when learning? Why? Because every crash, every fatality that results is preventable, and we can do better.

### The Program:

The In Memory Campaign's goal is to highlight fatal vehicle crashes we feel can speak to the entire community. To create discussion about the importance of safe driving and good decision making. We start by first identifying recent crashes and speaking to surviving family to seek permission and interest in their participation. Once this is obtained, we discuss, filming loved ones speaking about how the loss has impacted their family and how they have navigated the tragedy. We then make cards that can be distributed by officers on traffic stops that contain photos of the deceased with name and date of the crash and have driver safety messages on the back with a brief profile of the life lost. Once this is done, we discuss billboard, social media messaging and how we might conduct any safety enforcement operations to support the drive.

We attempt to highlight a few crashes pre year, with each crash taking a few months to plan and implement into reality. To date we have highlighted 5 crashes over the past two years. These efforts have caught the attention of our local TV and radio media who ran stories of the efforts.

This effort started while being entirely department driven, with no support or guidance from agencies outside Chesterfield County. In 2022 we sought blend our DMV speed enforcement efforts with the Campaign, by handing out the cards during several target operations in our high crash travel corridors. In two separate safety operations we stopped over 700 vehicles, issued 800 traffic summonses and handed out over 4000 In Memory Campaign cards.

The difficulty of this type of campaign is that there is really no way for use to measure its success, because we cannot measure crashes prevented or stopped due to this effort leading to conversation or discussion. Does the person who drives past a billboard slow down when they had been speeding? Did that reduction in speed prevent a crash? All we know and can measure is the effort we put in to preventing these tragedies.



## **CONSEJOS PARA PEATONES**


#### Hacer:
