2023 Elections By the Numbers

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

Number of Board of Supervisor seats on the ballot in 2023: 398

All 95 counties had seats up for election

Number of incumbents: 283

Number of new supervisors: 155 (pending

Loudoun County	\$362.7 million for public school facilities projects	Passed 70.99% Yes 29.01% No
Loudoun County	\$156.6 million for transportation projects	Passed 75.17% Yes 24.83% No
City of Manassas Park	Authorization of pari-mutuel wagering	Failed 41.15% Yes 58.85% No
Town of Hurt	Requesting the General Assembly to amend the Hurt Town Charter to reduce the number of members on the Town Council from six to four	Failed 14.99% Yes 85.01% No
