

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

Board of Supervisors seats on the ballot: 165

Open seats: 57Incumbents: 108

Number of contested races: 71

 Open seats contested: 27 (Includes one seat contested via write-in only)

 Incumbents contested: 44 (Includes one seat contested via write-in only)

Candidates running unopposed: 94

Open seats unopposed: 30Incumbents unopposed: 64

One write-in race with incumbent pending

Loudoun County	\$32.6 million for parks and recreation, library, and public safety projects	Passed 73.85% Yes 26.15% No
Loudoun County	\$75.6 million for school capital projects	Passed 65.08% Yes 34.92% No
Loudoun County	\$30.1 million for transportation projects	Passed 67.70% Yes 32.30% No
Northumberland County	Changing method of selecting school board to appointment by the governing body	Failed 36.08% Yes 63.92% No
Wise County	Creation of electric authority	Failed 46.08% Yes 53.92% No
City of Virginia Beach	Change in method of election for city council	Passed 53.11% Yes 46.89% No
